Although the Department of Health pays for fees in years 5 & 6, **Scottish domiciled** students should apply to SAAS for support as they administer the arrangement for the Department of Health. **English, Welsh and N. Irish** students should apply directly to the appropriate NHS Bursary Unit for bursary support and to local authority for other grants. **EU** students are entitled only to tuition fee support and should contact the NHS Bursary Unit in England for information. The Department of Health will pay tuition fees up to a certain amount. Check NHS Student Bursaries' website for up-to-date details (www.nhs.uk/sgu). For 2017 fees in Manchester and Barts will be £9,250 per annum for home/EU students.
