SLDN goes public at RSE event

Clear appetite for collaboration

The SLD Network's first public event at the RSE on 16 June drew a healthy audience despite blazing sun outside and its Friday tea-time scheduling.

Forty members of the public and other stakeholders attended Prof Brian Butterworth's talk on dyscalculia, its incidence and impact, and the related panel discussion with two young ambassadors from Dyslexia Scotland and Education Scotland's Senior Education Officer for Inclusion, Wellbeing and Equality; Frances Foreman. Both were informative and well received. In tandem with the public meeting, a focus group for teachers explored education resources for identifying dyslexia and yielded feedback on potential tools to aid teachers which will be used in follow-up focus groups. Focus group to define research priorities

Over the next few months PhD student Ailbhe McKinney from the University of Edinburgh will work with Sinead Rhodes, Silvia Paracchini, Jo Van Herwegen, and Michelle Luciano to set research priorities and develop research questions using the generic James Lind Alliance themes.

The findings from this research priority-setting exercise will use input from researchers and feedback from stakeholders to develop research questions. The project will also allow network members to get to know each other a bit more, figure out who wants to work on what and to put in place connections for collaborations. The longterm goal is to use some of this work to apply for future funding.

The focus group will likely involve one brief meeting early in the summer and a short workshop in August or early September for which minimal preparatory work is anticipated. It will involve turning up on the day and sharing potential plans for research or views on what research is needed. The project will focus on dyslexia, dyscalculia, and dysgraphia and more details will follow.
