Applicants should have self-employed status and will be engaged as fees-paid consultants by the University.

The successful candidate or candidates will be expected to be capable of teaching clinical skills to medical students in the clinical environment. This will be for a series of whole day placements, during academic semester time. We are particularly looking for sessional commitments on Tuesdays, with some potential availability on Fridays, ideally for the duration of a semester in the first instance

Candidates will normally be clinically qualified and be practising in a substantive clinical post, or about to start such a role, to qualify for the sessional posts. Exact dates and levels of commitment may be flexible and can be discussed with individual applicants. Excellent teaching skills and an interest in promoting knowledge exchange are essential. Overview of the School of Medicine, University of St Andrews

The School of Medicine employs approximately 250 staff in either full- or part-time contracts, with some staff jointly employed by the University and the NHS. The School is both teaching- and research-active, and engages students at both the undergraduate and postgraduate (both taught and research) level.

Since 2010 the School has been located in purpose-built accommodation on the North Haugh in St Andrews. The building is home to the staff offices, research labs, teaching facilities and a café.

The School currently teaches approximately 700 undergraduate medical students.

The majority of students are enrolled on the three-year BSc (Hons) Medicine course. After graduation from St Andrews these students go on to complete the clinical phase of their Primary Medical Qualification training at one of our six partner medical schools.

The Scottish Graduate Entry Medicine (ScotGEM) programme is a 4-year, graduate entry, undergraduate course delivered jointly by the Universities of St Andrews and Dundee, in collaboration with the University of the Highlands and Islands and NHS Scotland. The programme has a particular focus on Generalist Medicine in rural areas and utilises a Case Based Learning approach. Years 1 and 2 are primarily based in St Andrews, although placements will occur in four Scottish regions.

The new five-year St Andrews MBChB has been admitting students since 2024, with the first new curricular content to be delivered in 2026. This exciting new offering is a community-based medical degree, alongside hospital content, and will run with our existing BSc programme. This will allow a subgroup of students to complete their medical training at St Andrews without having to progress to a partner school and University.

The School is consistently ranked very highly in national student satisfaction surveys for the quality of its teaching and research and the overall student experience.

The research areas of the school are split into four divisions, Cellular Medicine, Education, Infection and Global Health and Population and Behavioural Science. Approximately 55 PhD students support our research, with 10 externally funded research staff and 35 Principal Investigators.

The School is committed to inclusivity and equal opportunities and values all applicants. The School holds an Athena SWAN Silver accreditation, demonstrating our commitment to equality and the advancement and promotion of the careers of women in science.

Main purpose

<u>Placement Tutoring</u>: Teaching clinically orientated material to undergraduate students, including "bed-side" teaching;

- Teach clinical medicine to all undergraduate students, on clinical placement in NHS Fife, including clinical and communication skills
- Teach basic clinical reasoning skills
- Teach interpretation of investigations, and how it relates to disease and pathology
- Provide supervision of students in the clinical environment
- Pro-actively seek appropriate learning opportunities on placements, in conjunction, where possible, with the multidisciplinary team

Assessment

Engage with formative assessment/feedback on students' placement performance

Curriculum development and quality assurance

Engage with student feedback on the placement experience and quality assurance processes

Special Requirements:

The place of work will be teaching in NHS premises in Fife, potentially within primary and secondary care settings, but typically in community hospitals. Applicants therefore may be expected to be able to travel to different sites across Fife. Exact placement localities will be discussed with the successful applicants. Tuesday + / - Friday availability is required for the sessional role.

The applicant should expect to engage with continuing professional development.
